Bob Weimer from PWSA – described analyses by the state, DEP, EPA, the state and county Historically we have fallen on hard times – his job to get the organization in the right direction. Watermark training program within PWSA – purpose is to develop skills for any PWSA worker to get up to speed with the times. New billing, telephone, customer service operations. Suffered a number of failures this year. State came microfiltration plant, lanpher reservoir, improvements to pump stations at bracken and aspinwall (no backup systems). Hope to start using Orthophosphate as an additive to minimize lead corrosion in pipes. Lead service line replacements – required to replace 7% / year. PWSA will be under the PUC's jurisdiction after April 2<sup>nd</sup>
