CSA Produce Pickup At Pear and Pickle

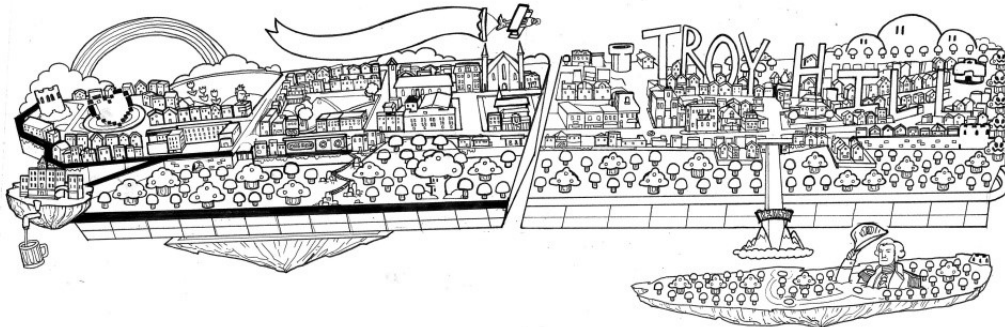
